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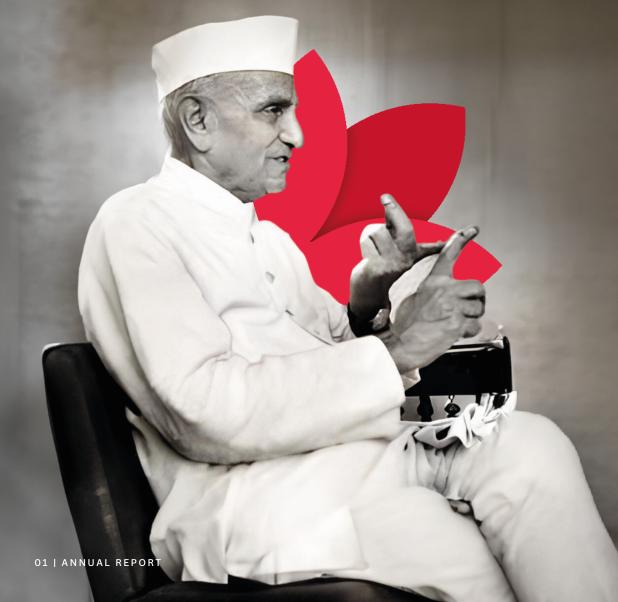


### Dr. Jivraj Mehta

(First Chief Minister of Gujarat)

Dr. Jivraj N Mehta (1887-1978) stood as a distinguished figure in the fields of medicine, freedom struggle, administration, and also held the distinction of being the inaugural Chief Minister of Gujarat. Notably, he served as the personal physician to Mahatma Gandhi. Born on August 29, 1887, in Amreli, he pursued his education at the esteemed Grant Medical College and JJ Hospital in Bombay. His academic journey extended to London from 1909 to 1915, during which he accomplished his FRCS and MD.

Following a period of health-related challenges and a successful tenure of practicing medicine for the Tata family and the Baroda State, he took on the mantle of the first Dean of KEM Hospital in Bombay in 1925. Tragically, Dr. Jivraj Mehta's life journey came to an end on November 7, 1978.

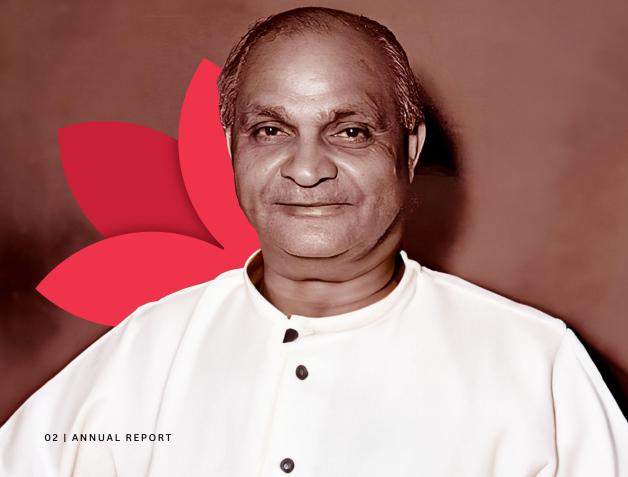


### Shri Ratubhai Adani

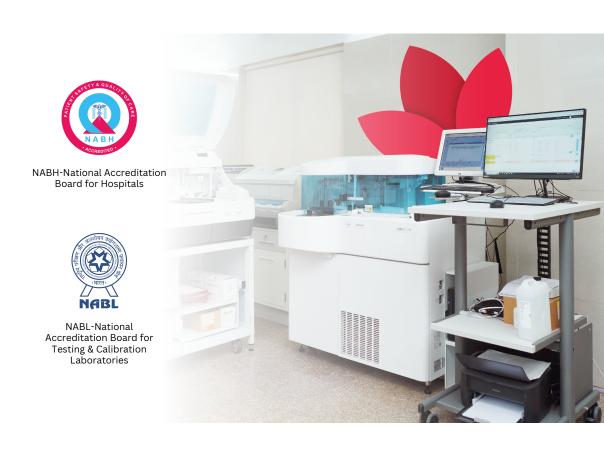

### Opinion

We have audited the financial statements of DR JIVRAJ MEHTA SMARAK HEALTH FOUNDATION, Bakeri Medical Research Centre (the "Trust") which comprise the Balance Sheet as at 31st March, 2023 and the Income and Expenditure Account for the year then ended in which are included their Units(Health Care Unit & Research Unit)which are separately audited by us, and notes to the financial statements, including a summary of Significant Accounting Policies and other explanatory information.

In our opinion, the accompanying financial statements give a true and fair view of the financial position of the Trust as at 31st March, 2023 and excess of income over expenditure for the year then ended and are prepared, in all material respects, in accordance with The Gujarat Public Trusts Act, 1950 (Bom. XXIX of 1950).

### **Basis for Opinion**

We conducted our audit in accordance with the Standards on Auditing ("SAs") issued by ICAI. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. We are independent of the Trust in accordance with the Code of Ethics issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India ("ICAI") together with the ethical requirements that are relevant to our audit of the financial statements. An audit is carried out considering the provisions of The Gujarat Public Trusts Act, 1950 (Bom. XXIX of 1950) and the rules there under, and we have fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with these requirements and the Code of Ethics. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion.

### Responsibilities of Management and those charged with Governance for the Financial Statements

Management of the Trust is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in accordance with The Gujarat Public Trusts Act, 1950 (Bom. XXIX of 1950) for safeguarding of the assets of the Trust and for preventing and detecting frauds and other irregularities; selection and application of appropriate accounting policies; making judgments and estimates that are reasonable and prudent; and design, implementation and maintenance of adequate internal financial controls, that were operating effectively for ensuring the accuracy and completeness of the accounting records, relevant to the preparation and presentation of the financial statements that give a true and fair view and are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

In preparing the financial statements, management of the Trust is responsible for assessing the Trust's ability to continue as a going concern, disclosing, as applicable, matters related to going concern and using the going concern basis of accounting unless management either intends to liquidate the entity or to cease operations, or has no realistic alternative but to do so. Those charged with governance are responsible for overseeing the Trust's financial reporting process.



### Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Statements

We also provide those charged with governance with a statement that we have complied with the relevant ethical requirements regarding independence, and to communicate with them all relationships and other matters that may reasonably be thought to bear on our independence, and where applicable, related safeguards.

#### 1. TRUST INFORMATION AND REGISTRATIONS UNDER VARIOUS STATUTES:

- a. Dr. Jivraj Mehta Smarak Health Foundation was registered under the Bombay Public Trusts Act, 1950 on 29.11.1983 having Registration No. F/951/Ahmedabad.

2. As required under the Statute, the Foundation has maintained separate set of books of account for Research and Healthcare units, which are separately audited. Accordingly, along with consolidated financial statements, separate financial statements of Research and Healthcare units are presented herewith.

#### 3. METHOD OF ACCOUNTING:

Method of Accounting is on Accrual Basis.



#### 4. USES OF ESTIMATES:

The Preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported balances of assets and liabilities and the disclosure relating to contingent liabilities as at the date of financial statements and reported amounts of income and expenses during the reporting period. Although these estimates are based upon management's best knowledge of current events and actions, actual results could differ from those estimates. Estimates and underlying assumptions are reviewed at each Balance Sheet date. Any revision to accounting estimates is recognized in the period in which the estimate is revised.

#### 5. PROPERTY, PLANT AND EQUIPMENT (PPE) AND DEPRECIATION:

- a. Property, Plant & Equipment PPE (other than the PPE received as Donation in Kind) are stated at their historical cost of acquisition and/or construction. The cost comprises the purchase price, including imports duties and non-refundable purchase taxes and such costs directly attributable to bringing the asset to the location and condition necessary for it to be capable of operating in the manner intended by management. The PPE received as Donation in kind are stated at their fair market value on the date of receipt.
  - (Please refer to Note No. 7 here in below in respect of Assets in Kind.)
- b. **Depreciation/ Amortisation:** Depreciation on PPE has been provided on written down value (WDV) method at the rates prescribed under the Income Tax Rules, 1962.
- c. Lease Hold Land is amortised over the period of lease term i.e. 99 years.
- d. Method of Accounting of PPE and depreciation thereon as mentioned in (a) and (b) above are subject to the method of accounting followed in respect of PPE acquired out of CSR funds which is explained in Note No. 6 below.

#### 6. CSR FUNDS, PROPERTY, PLANT AND EQUIPMENT (PPE) AND DEPRECIATION:

- a. The Trust has been registered for undertaking CSR activities as the Implementing Agency for the specified companies which are under CSR obligations as per the provisions of Section 135, Schedule VII and the Companies (CSR Policy) Rules, 2014 (as amended), under the Companies Act, 2013. These companies have given CSR donations to the Trust for Ongoing Projects and for Other than Ongoing Projects for creating PPE (medical equipments etc.) and for utilisation on the objects of the Trust.
- b. The accounting policy in regard to measurement, recognition and disclosure of such different CSR funds are as under:
- CSR Funds for Ongoing Projects and for Other than Ongoing Projects for creating PPE are shown as Earmarked Funds in the Balance Sheet and funds for utilisation on the objects of the Trust are recognised as Revenue Donations in the Income and Expenditure Account.
- Property, Plant and Equipment created out of CSR Funds where the ownership has been passed on to the Trust have been separately recognised and disclosed in the Schedule of Property, Plant and Equipment. (Schedule-B).
- PPE created out of CSR Funds for the Hospital has been measured and recognised in the Financial Statements of Healthcare Unit.
- No Depreciation has been provided in the books of account in respect of such PPE created out of CSR Funds (either shown in the Financial Statements of Research Unit or Healthcare Unit).



#### 7. ASSETS IN KIND:

Any PPE received by the Trust in kind where the ownership has been passed on to the Trust has been valued at Fair Value on the date of receipt. No depreciation has been provided in the books of account on such PPE received in kind.

#### 8. REVENUE RECOGNITION:

- Revenue is recognised when consideration can be measured reliably and there exists reasonable certainty of its recovery.
- Healthcare Income is recognised as and when services are rendered which normally coincides when invoices are raised.
- c. Pharmacy Income is recognised as and when the medicines are sold to the patients
- d. Interest Income is recognised on time proportion basis.

#### 9. INVESTMENTS:

Investments are stated at the cost price.

#### 10. INVENTORIES:

Inventory of Drugs, Medicines and other consumables are valued at cost (FIFO Method), as taken, valued and certified by the management.

- 11. Common expenses including depreciation/ amortisation (other than directly attributable to any specific unit) are allocated/ apportioned between Healthcare Unit and Research Unit in the ratio of 70:30 respectively.
- 12. In the opinion of the management, the current assets and loans and advances are approximately of the value stated, if realized in the ordinary course of the Trust's activities and all known liabilities have been fully provided for in the books of account unless otherwise stated.
- 13. Outstanding balances as on 31st March, 2023 in respect of Sundry Credit balances, Other Liabilities, Receivables, Advances and Deposits given are subject to confirmation, reconciliation and adjustments, if any.
- **14.** Previous year's figures have been regrouped, re-arranged or re-classified wherever necessary to make them comparable with the current year's figures.
